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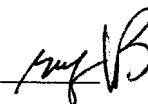
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Schedule A

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APA recognizes the business needs of libraries and other customers to retain potential access to content for which they have purchased current access. APA's annual data fees cover current content. As a courtesy to customers and users, APA provides all backfiles without additional fees during the period of time the customer pays for a site license. If, at a later date, a customer does not renew the site license, they will retain rights to access all APA full-text journal articles published from the first actual year through the last year for which they paid data fees, without paying additional data fees. If the customer desires access to full-text content files from years prior to the years in which they paid, APA will make those files available for a fee.
