Future of WEST -AGUA Systems Development Capacity



 Recommendation: Keep maintaining what we have; reduce capacity for building new features

Member feedback:

- 90% agreed with the recommendation
- 7% trusted the WEST Executive Committee to make the decision
- Themes
- Status: Implemented
- The path forward: Development period to start in January

- As of FY24-25 Average of 2019, 2020, and 2021 total library expenditures data
- Annual 3% increase to account for inflation

What are the benefits?

For WEST and its Member Libraries:

- Additional or new digital copies with access via ILL and print disabled access requests
- Positive communication framing for deselection projects



For Internet Archive:

- Expansion of their digital serial and journal collection
- Library expertise and feedback on processes and workflows

For the Library Community:

- Additional or new digital copies with access via ILL and print disabled access requests
- Testing new workflows that other organizations could adopt or adapt





Play to everyone's strengths and existing work

WEST - group data aggregation, analysis, and coordination of collective action

- Member libraries collections and collection decision-making
- Internet Archive digitization and ongoing access



Match-making with the pilot libraries

- Planning or currently engaged in serial review & weeding
- Able to commit staff time to test new workflows
- Volume of target content presents a good value proposition
 - WEST conducts an initial comparison to help the libraries assess this
- Potential other factors
 - Priority level of the content (i.e. fewer existing digital access points)
 - Completeness of holdings
 - Low overlap among pilot libraries (i.e. ensuring that we are addressing a range of content)

Current state

- WEST Access Policy
 - WEST archives only
 - Local lending policies
- Resource sharing groups
 - OCLC Profiled Group
 - > RapidILL pod

Opportunities

- Maintaining a consistent level of access to titles that were deaccessioned
- Ease operational requirements
- Distribute responsibility across all members
- Align WEST with national peers

Enhanced ILL Partnership



Member feedback from the 2023 survey

Respondents support:

- an expanded scope for the WEST Access Policy as a benefit of membership.
- an expanded WEST Access Policy that covers both WEST archived collections and general circulating collections.
- Respondents placed the highest value on:
 - response/turnaround time
 - accessibility of scans in an updated policy

Status:

- WEST Operations and Collections Council engaged with the survey results
- On hold as of early 2024

- Draft policy changes and seek feedback from resource sharing experts

Expanding National Collaborative Activities

This is a high value proposition for my organization, libraries writ large. Multiple shared print groups can appear to be disparate, competing, entities. A collective collection requires a high level coordination and engagement for it to work and for it to be viewed as it needs to be: serious, committed, and professional. If * done right it become as ingrained in the brains of faculty as their preferred reliable research database or journal.

The Path Forward - The Shared Print Partnership

- There will be a 'bridge year' from July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025
 The Bridge-Year Executive Committee will vote on a \$3000 per
 - program (not per library) annual membership fee for the bridge year
- WEST will participate in the bridge year
